
Wahissa Receives National Grant

It is a great honor for Wahissa Lodge of Old Hickory Council to be one of 15 lodges in the nation to receive a matching service grant for the year of 2012. All 15 lodges/ councils will receive a combined total of \$40,000 in service grants. Wahissa Lodge/Old Hickory Council will receive \$1,725 to assist in the construction of a training and instructional shelter to be located at Camp Raven Knob behind the Wahissa Lodge Building.

The shelter is currently underway as clearing of the site began in November. The purpose of the shelter is to provide a facility to instruct Cub Scouting and Boy Scouting skills. The shelter will be used for leadership training to assist the Council's NYLT courses and the Lodge's leadership development. The shelter also will be used for various Lodge and Chapter activities. The shelter will provide a location for merit badge instructions during the summer camp season. It is the intent of Camp Raven Knob to utilize the shelter for instruction of the Indian lore merit badge. The shelter will also provide a location for camp staff and campers to meet for training purposes. This project will have a great impact on Old Hickory Council and Camp Raven Knob's Scouting program. Each

year Camp Raven Knob will host approximately 5,000 Scouts during its summer camp program. During a single week of summer camp, there will be approximately 100 boys that will be taking the Indian lore merit badge. In previous years the merit badge has been taught under a tarp. The building of this new shelter will give a more suitable home for the Indian lore merit badge.

The naming of the training shelter will be in honor of Josh Davis. Josh was an avid scouter and student of Native American traditions and served Wahissa Lodge as its Vice Chief of Indian Affairs for several years. Josh was a Straight Dancer and a Singer who competed on the Section and the National levels. Josh also severed as a section leader as well as IA chairman for several years. There was nothing else that Josh loved more than seeing, the fellow youth taking part in Indian Affairs programs on all levels. Wahissa Lodge looks forward to this opportunity and is honored to have been recognized on this level.
