INDIAN SEMINAR INFORMATION

Are you looking for more information on how to make a great dance or ceremonies outfit? Then you need to consider going to the Carolina's O.A. Indian Seminar. This is an annual event held by Eswau Huppeday Lodge in Statesville, North Carolina. The event will start on January 25, 2013, Friday night with a pow wow dance. Saturday will have sessions about every hour on a different topic. You do not have to preregister for the classes. The sessions will be on different styles of pow wow dances, outfits for dancing and ceremonies, singing and drum, sessions on American Indian crafts and culture area. These are all fun sessions with practical hands on experience.

You will see many of the dancers and instructor that are at NOAC at this Statesville event. Groups come from Florida, Indiana and Ohio. Saturday night is the big pow wow, with over 300 dancers. You do not need an outfit to dance and you do not need to be in the OA.



The cost is \$38 per person for the event. The fee includes three meals on Saturday and Sunday breakfast. They have limited ability to stay on the campus. Many stay in a local motel at reasonable rates. The classes are held at Mitchell Community College Education Center at Statesville, North Carolina. This is one of the best events to learn about American Indian crafts and culture.

On Saturday, November 10th, National Order of the Arrow Chief John Rehm presided over a National Court of Honor at Cherokee Scout Reservation as Arrowmen from all over North Carolina gathered to help celebrate the presentation of the Order of the Arrow's Distinguished Service Award to Ted Williams. The Distinguished Service Award is a service recognition award for those who have rendered distinguished and outstanding service to the OA on a sectional, regional, or national basis over a period of years. Since the first awards were given in 1940, only 908 Distinguished Service Awards have been presented. This alone is a testament to its high standard of excellence. Ted is a member of Tsiootsi Tsogalii Lodge, and has served as our section staff adviser since 1994, and is the assistance scout executive of the Old North State Council. Section SR-7B congratulates Ted on receiving this well-deserved honor and thanks him for the many years of service he has provided to our Arrowmen.
