SECTION ELECTIONS

Brothers,

As Conclave nears, arrowmen may consider running for a section leadership position, the four positions are: Section Chief, Section Vice-Chief of Programs, Section Vice-Chief of Training, and Section Secretary. If you are interested in running, please inform me via email, dustinkock@gmail.com, and send the Section Adviser, Bud Harrelson, a letter of approval from your Council Scout Executive, via budharrelson@gmail.com. All letters of approval must be submitted to Bud Harrelson prior to the start of the Friday night show at conclave. Letters will not be accepted after 8:30PM.

The election process for section offices begin at the Friday night show. Anyone who has a letter of approval may be nominated and allowed to give a short speech. Then, Saturday afternoon after the quest events conclude, the elections will take place. Anyone that has a letter of approval may still be nominated until the floor is closed for nominations. After nominations are closed, the elections will begin. Each candidate per position will have another opportunity to give a short speech and answer questions from the audience. This process will be repeated until we elect our new section officers. I hope everyone is as excited as I am about the future leadership of our section!

CHARLEY SULLIVAN MEMORIAL WALKWAY

Charley Sullivan (1920 - 2007) , past National Committee member and Occoneechee Lodge Adviser, served the Order of the Arrow for over 40 years. Mr. Sullivan received the Silver Beaver, Vigil Honor, Silver Antelope and OA Distinguished Service Award. Over the past 2 years, the Occoneechee Lodge completed major renovations to the former Camp Durant Dining Hall and transformed the facility into the new Charley Sullivan Lodge Building, named in his honor.

To show support for the memory of Charley Sullivan, the SR-7B Council of Chiefs decided this year to name the Section Spirit award in honor of Charley Sullivan, recognizing the Spirit of the Arrowman in all aspects of Brotherhood and Cheerfulness and Service.

Many people remember Mr. Sullivan and the mark he left on Scouting and the Order of the Arrow. While the renovation to the Sullivan Building is almost complete, there are still aspects that need to be funded and completed. There is an opportunity for everyone to contribute in his honor by making a donation in his name through the purchase of an engraved brick in the walkway.

This award is intended to provide a tool for lodges to recognize, provide incentive, and operationalize unit-level participation in Order of the Arrow programs.

The OA Unit of Excellence Award criteria recognize units that invite the lodge to conduct quality unit elections, participate in lodge events and meetings, and operate a complete OA Troop/Team Representative program.

This year's conclave program will feature several orientation sessions for the Unit Award of Excellence (UAE) on Saturday on the Health Lodge Porch:

10:30-11:30 – Unit Award of Excellence Orientation for Unit Leaders
