## REPORT TO THE STATE

Arrowmen from across the State of North Carolina recorded service projects completed in 2014 for their annual presentation to state officials. On Monday, February 9, 2015 at 4 pm, the Boy Scouts of North Carolina presented their annual [Report to the State](#) in the chambers of the North Carolina House of Representatives where a formal House Resolution (HR 57) was approved to honor them.

The report includes many notable facts: There are over 71,000 youth members, 27,000 adult volunteers, and approximately 6,000 Arrowmen in the State of North Carolina. In 2014, 1,800 scouts achieved the rank of Eagle Scout. Over 565,000 hours of service were completed across the state in the year 2014, which equals to more than \$12 million.

In celebration of the centennial anniversary of the Order of the Arrow, North Carolina's Scouts and Arrowmen have committed to perform at least one service project in each of state's one hundred counties during the year 2015. The Order's centennial theme is *Centuries of Service*. This commitment will be a collaborative effort by SR-7B, SR-5, and SR-7A who cover the geographic area within the state. Efforts will be coordinated and led by SR-7B.
