







Meet the Section: Vice Chief of Program

Jordan Kornegay from Nayawin Rar lodge currently serves as your Vice Chief of Program. He is planning the program that will make Conclave 2016 great. Here's what Jordan had to say about his position.

Q: What experience do you have in the OA?

A: I was tapped out in the summer of 2011 at Camp Tuscarora. I went through my ordeal in October of the same year. From there, I began to serve as my troop's OA Representative. The following fall, I attained my brotherhood and was elected to serve as chapter chief for the 2013 term. I served as my lodge's Treasurer and Trading Post Committee Chair in 2014. In that winter, I began tackling my hardest task in the Order yet, Conclave Chair. This time in my life I was able to develop so much as I leader and am thankful for the opportunity, but of course, thankful that it is over. And last but not least, I am now serving as your Vice Chief of Program.

Q: What duties do you have as Vice Chief of Program?

A: The Vice Chief of Program duties include drafting the annual Section planbook, oversight of planning/execution of Cardinal, preparing the section's needs list for conclave, working with the service lodge in planning/executing conclave, and being a good representation of the Section, the Order, and Scouting.

Q: Is there a difference between lodge and section level leadership?

A: I feel that there is quite the difference between lodge and section leadership. For instance, on the lodge level, most LECs convene once a month, and on the section level we only convene as a group about twice a year. There's a lot less face to face interaction with the entire leadership team, and a lot more phone calls and one on one meet ups.

Q: How have you been impacted by the centennial of the Order of the Arrow? What impression did NOAC leave on you?

A: Being able to be a youth in this organization during the centennial is quite the blessing. This year has been incredibly exciting for our Order and our Section. We have bettered our conclave, and initiated more community service than before. NOAC was also an amazing experience. It was really awesome to run into scouting friends that I have from across the country at an event with 15,000 people, as well as survivalist and Eagle Scout Creek Stewart. I mean what are the chances? I probably had the best time being able to spend these moments with he brothers from my lodge, both old and new.

Q: What do you plan to do differently at Conclave this year? Is there anything new to look forward to?

A: Conclave this year will be absolutely phenomenal! One of our exciting new additions is the SR-7B's got Talent competition scheduled during Cardinival this year. It is going to be a very entertaining and intriguing part of our conclave and will be the hub of the Cardinival block party.
